Request for proposal

Hamilton Community Foundation is requesting a brief proposal to conduct a community scan and literature review to support development of the Foundation's EDI and granting strategies.

Submission deadline for proposals is 5 pm January 12, 2023, anticipating that work will begin in late January, and be completed by March 31, 2023.

Background

Hamilton Community Foundation was established in 1954 as Ontario's first community foundation. Today, it is a member of over 190 community foundations across Canada and a rapidly-expanding international network. In a nutshell, community foundations have three roles:

- Working with donors to build funds that support local charities
- Giving grants across all sectors of the community: arts and culture, education, recreation, health and human services and the environment
- Community leadership bringing people together to address issues and opportunities facing their communities

HCF is driven by its:

- Vision: A vibrant, diverse and inclusive Hamilton, and
- Mission: To drive positive change by connecting diverse people, ideas and resources.

Scope of Work

In the first year of our 2022-2027 Strategic Plan, we are reviewing and exploring granting practices, in alignment with the strategic objective of increasing the capacity and health of equity-deserving organizations and communities to address systemic barriers. We are seeking a consultant to help advance this work through two distinct but related activities:

- Completion of a community scan and mapping of equity-deserving community-led organizations and equity-deserving community-serving organizations; and
- 2. Completion of a review of literature and research on participatory granting models and recommendation of models with strong prospect of with HCF's work and the local context.

Proposal Content

If you are interested in bidding on this work, please provide us with a **brief** proposal by January 12, 2023, that includes the following:

- Your understanding of the work and your process to accomplish it.
- Any examples of your work that demonstrate your experience in conducting similar projects.
- Your expectations of support from the HCF team in order to complete the work.
- Deliverables. We expect that at a minimum this would include:
 - (a) Community Mapping:
 - A mapping resource that identifies and describes equitydeserving community-led and equity-deserving community-serving organizations, based on the categories and definitions to be provided by HCF
 - A concise written report that describes process through which the mapping resource was developed

(b) Literature review:

- Description of the literature review strategy including inclusion/exclusion criteria
- A detailed report describing a full range of participatory granting models, highlighting models with strong prospect of alignment with HCF's strategy, values and the local community context.
- An Executive Summary that can be shared with a range of people and organizations.
- A detailed reference list of all articles/reports reviewed
- Fee proposal, plus hourly and per diem rates for any additional services.

• The names and contact information for two people we may contact, whom you have worked with in the past, ideally on similar projects.

Our estimated budget for this project is \$12,000. All work must be completed, and final reports received by March 31, 2023.

Experience and qualifications:

The successful consultant will have an in-depth knowledge of the social and community services sector in Hamilton and extensive qualitative research experience. Experience working with community groups and equity-deserving communities are essential; experience working with local (Hamilton area) groups is considered an asset.

Evaluations

Proposals will be evaluated on:

- Understanding of HCF and its goals
- The proposed approach to achieving the goals of the project
- Past performance demonstrated expertise in providing similar projects
- Fees

While the number of consultants being invited to this call is small, we will likely wish to have a call with a shorter list before our final decision. We anticipate making a final selection by January 27, 2023, at the latest.
